Mike Hall, our Shellfish Warden, asked residents to please report any instances of clam flat pollution (overboard discharge, human waste, dog waste, etc.) observed, as it is very easy to contaminate a whole flat in this manner.

Caroline will try to solicit food donations from the local markets. The breakfast will be held at 10 a.m. on Memorial Day at the Prospect Harbor Women's Club.
