TOWN OFFICE TRANSITIONIN TO A FOUR-DAY WORK WEEK- The Town Office will be transitioning to a four-day work week beginning November 9, 2026. The new office hours will be Monday through Thursday, 7:45AM – 5PM, closed on Fridays. We will still maintain being closed for lunch break from 12:15PM – 1PM. Many of our services are available online, making it easier and more convenient for residents to take care of business from the comfort of your home. Residents can use the online services for vehicle registration renewals, hunting and fishing licenses, vital record requests, property tax payments, and more. COMING IN OCTOBER: EMS & FY27 BUDGET DISCUSSION- The Town is planning an informational Town Hall in mid-October to discuss proposed changes to the FY27 budget, primarily related to expanding EMS staffing to provide a paid crew around the clock and better ensure reliable emergency response. The Town Hall is tentatively planning for **October 14th or 15th**, followed by a **Special Town Meeting around October 28th or 29th** at which voters will consider the necessary additional appropriation. GOULDSBORO POLICE DEPARTMENT- *Effective immediately, due to safety concerns, the Town of Gouldsboro will no longer allow signs to be posted on the Village Green in West Gouldsboro, located at the intersection of Route 186 and Clinic Road. Any signs placed in this location will be removed by law enforcement. Thank you for understanding and your cooperation in helping keep our roads safe!*

The Gouldsboro and Winter Harbor Police Department are pleased to offer a new program called “The Sunshine Program”, a free outreach service to senior residents and individuals who live alone within our communities. 🌞 **The Sunshine Program** is a simple daily wellness check designed to ensure the safety and well-being of participating residents. The way the program works is a couple times a week, in the morning, a member of the Police Departments will attempt to place a brief telephone call to program participants. The purpose of the call is to simply confirm everything is okay. If we are unable to reach a participant during the initial call, a second call will be attempted. If we are still unable to make contact, an officer may be dispatched to the residence to ensure the individual is safe. This program is intended for senior residents, residents who live alone, and residents who may benefit from a daily check-in. Participation is completely voluntary and may be discontinued at any time at your request.

MOORING PERMITS- Please be aware, ALL mooring fees are due by July 1st and can be paid until August 31st by 4PM without penalty. Starting September 1st, a late fee of \$200 and processing fees will be added to all outstanding fees. Please come into the Town Office to pay these fees.
