SELECT BOARD / TOWN MANAGER- Got housing? Need two volunteers to administer a Facebook page for available, year-round rental housing or long-term winter housing in Gouldsboro and Winter Harbor. This page will NOT be associated with the Town Office. The Facebook page will include a disclaimer that it in no way endorses the quality of the rental housing nor the owner. People are welcome to post their available housing, including single room rentals. Persons seeking housing are welcome to list their housing needs as well. The volunteer administrators will screen the listings for clarity and appropriateness before posting. The housing crunch will be resolved in many ways and hopefully this is one solution. The first half of property taxes were due October 31st. Voters approved interest beginning November 1st. Please call for an updated amount. You can now pay online at https://epayment.informe.org/payportonline/disclaimer/1 502. If you're sending a check, please make sure it's payable to the Town of Gouldsboro. If you pay with a credit card over the phone, in the Town Office or online, there is a 2.5% charge fee for anything over \$40. This fee goes directly to the state.

Schoodic Community Fund awarded \$750 to our Power Fund. This fund is fully sustained by donations and not tax dollars. SCF Endowment accepts donations and invests in with the Maine Community Foundation. The principal amount is never spent but instead invested and at the end of the year interest is available to award to local non-profits. ELECTIONS- The State of Maine Referendum Election will be held on November 7th, 2023. Polls will be open from 8AM – 8PM at the Gouldsboro Rec Center located at 679 Pond Road, Gouldsboro Maine. If you are not yet a registered voter, the Registrar will be present all day for you to register. If you plan to register on election day, please bring a photo ID and proof of residence with you. Acceptable form of residency includes Maine Drivers License or Identification card, vehicle registration, utility bill, rent receipt or lease, receipt of public benefit, government or payroll check. All forms of residency MUST show their Gouldsboro address. If you have any questions,

RSU 24- The focus of the building project is coming to an agreement on the domestic water cistern project. The estimated cost of the project is still quite high (over \$600,000), we continue to have conversations with the Maine Department of Education, the architect, and the general contractor about how to proceed.
