SELECT BOARD / TOWN MANAGER- We have scheduled a special town meeting for Tuesday December 12, 2023 @ 5PM at the town office. The warrant includes one article that addresses amendments to the current Shoreland Zoning Ordinance. Amendments are also posted on our website @ www.gouldsborotown.com.

We would like to welcome Mike Connors as our newly appointed Code Enforcement Officer. Mike is currently here in the office a few days a week. Mike has been working for the last two months in meeting the needs of our residents and contractors. As he transitions into the position, he seeks to utilize his varied work experiences to best meet the needs of our community. Whether working in healthcare, information technologies, facilities management, or as a contractor, Mike has and always enjoyed serving. Providing instruction and direction in common language has always been the most satisfying facet of his work. He firmly believes that strong relational connections and clear communications are the foundation of any successful collaboration and a good sense of humor helps too! While not at work, Mike can often be found working outside or solving a mechanical problem!

As you are aware, the Senior Property Tax Stabilization program that was in place during 2023 was repealed last summer and left most of you in a difficult position in regards to helping with relief on upcoming property tax payments. The State of ME has had another program for a few years called "**The Property Tax Fairness Credit**" that was eligible to senior Mainers earning up to only \$40,000 per year with a tax credit of \$1,500. The earning ceiling has been lifted in **2024 to \$80,000** but you must FILE a FEDERAL & STATE of ME income tax return in order to be eligible for the \$2,000 tax credit. The form to use: "**Schedule PTFC/STFC**" when you file your State of ME income tax return is not yet available from **Maine.gov** but I expect that it will be soon after the first of the new year. We will also have copies of the form here in the Town Office when it is available. If you have any questions about this tax credit program, please call the Assessor's Office on Tuesday or Wednesday when Pam is in the Office.

Another great team member we are happy to welcome is Wally Moore and working in the capacity of Road Commissioner. Wally served as a select board member for a few years and has been a life long resident here in Gouldsboro. We are thankful he is willing to help us at this time.

RSU 24- We have formally signed the Change Order for the domestic water cistern project. The tank and pump house that will support the domestic water will be located in the vicinity of the fire sprinkler cistern between the Punkinville Road and the school. Nickerson O'Day will be the general contractor and the estimated completion target is April or May, depending on the weather. The major part of the remaining work on the overall contract is the ball fields. We will be working through that part of the contract in the spring as the ground thaws and the grass grows. With the winter weather approaching, please know that cancellation notifications will be made to families using our robocall and text message notification system(s). General notification will be put on our Facebook Page and sent to the local television and radio stations. For those interested in the work of the RSU Board of Directors, the full Board meetings and subcommittee meetings are posted on our website (www.rsu24.org). It is hard to believe that we are already beginning the budget process for fiscal year 2025. At this point, we are establishing internal dates and working through the logistical pieces in order to complete the process in a timely fashion. Please note that the budget workshops will take place on Wednesday evenings and the following dates have been established for this work: January 31st, February 14th and 28th, and March 13th and 27th. At each meeting, specific components of our school budget will be presented for the Budget and Finance Committee consideration. The meetings are held at the District Services Facility and the public is welcome to participate. For our parents, the last day of school before December vacation will be December 22nd.
