Happy New Year!!

SELECT BOARD / TOWN MANAGER- We are so thankful for our Police, EMS, Fire Departments and Emergency Management folks for helping to keep our community safe during the December rain storms. We appreciate every one of you.

At a recent board meeting we discussed the possibility of installing additional street lights within our community. We are interested in hearing from you if you know of a place that a light might benefit the safety of our travelers. Typically, we would consider main road intersections. After we get a list of places, Versant will send a planner to help to determine cost for the town. Please call or visit the town office if you have a place in mind.

We are moving along with our Housing Project. Recently the Town of Winter Harbor and SERC have donated funds to our community for a housing study in both communities, along with recent grants from Maine Community Foundation and Schoodic Community Fund. There will be no taxpayer funds used for this portion of the project. We hired Camoine Associates, from Saratoga Springs, NY to kick off the project by collecting housing, demographic and economic data from a variety of sources. The analysis will provide a determination of the current projected future housing needs of the towns. We will keep the community informed along the way and the final survey results.

The climate vulnerability assessment that Gouldsboro received last fall (see www.gouldsboroshore.me) identified places along the coast where a big storm could damage roads. In some places, a washed-out road would cut people off from emergency services and disrupt businesses. The town's Coastal Resilience Committee is preparing two requests to the State to provide money for scoping and design work to reduce vulnerabilities along Corea Road, where a storm could interfere with access to the harbor and travel between Corea and the rest of the town. The committee's meetings are open to the public, and the next meeting is Monday, January 8th at 5PM in the Town Office.

Thank you, Joe Depasquale for volunteering your professional services and repairing our "Welcome to Gouldsboro" sign on Route 1. You rock!

Starting February 1st, a \$25 late fee for dog registrations will take effect. We do not have any control over this fee. Dog licenses are an important tool for dog owners and animal control officers as well. This increases our ability to track and return lost dogs, and show current rabies titer for the animal should a bite happen.
